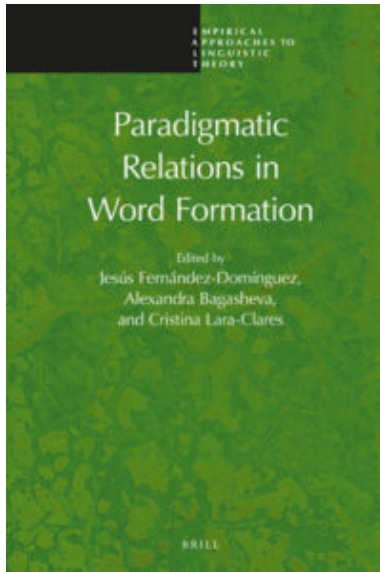




Paradigmatic Relations in Word Formation
